FOUNDATIONS IN CHRISTIAN MINISTRY

The Diocese is offering up to 25 people a year of lay formation. This might lead into:

- Training to be a Reader, over two further years
- Training to be a pastoral assistant
- Training to be an evangelist

This opportunity is mainly for those exploring a lay vocation, though you may also be recommended to do this year by the Diocesan Director of Ordinands.

The first step is to talk to your parish priest and explore whether he or she would like to sponsor you for this year.

The basic commitment will be six Saturday study days, plus involvement in courses in your local mission community.

The costs are met by the Diocese through its contract with South West Ministry Training Course, though you would still be responsible for your own costs for travel and books.

Interviews for the year will take place after Easter and the programme itself will start in September.
