My God my God look upon me: why hast thou forsaken me? and art so far from my health: and from the words of my complaint? O my God I cry in the daytime and thou hearest not: and in the night season also I take no rest. And thou continuest holy: O thou worship of Israel. Our fathers hoped in thee: they trusted in thee and thou didst deliver them. They called upon thee and were holpen; they put their trust in thee and were not confounded. But as for me I am a worm and no man: a very scorn of men and the outcast of the people. All they that see me laugh me to scorn: they shoot out their lips and shake **their heads saving:** He trusted in God that he would deliver him: let him deliver him if he will have him. They stand staring and looking upon me: they part my garments among them, and cast lots

upon my <u>vesture</u>. Save me from the lion's <u>mouth</u>: thou hast heard me also from among the horns of the <u>unicorns</u>. **O praise the Lord ye that <u>fear him</u>: magnify him, all ye of the seed of <u>Jacob</u>. They shall be counted unto the Lord for a gene<u>ration</u>: they shall come and the heavens shall declare his <u>righteousness</u>. Unto a people that shall be born: whom the Lord hath made.**

Offertory Psalm: Thy rebuke hath broken my heart I am full of heaviness: I looked for some to have pity on me but there was no man: neither found I any to comfort me; they gave me gall to eat and when I was thirsty they gave me vinegar to drink.

Communion Psalm: O my Father if this cup may not pass away from me except I drink it: **thy will be done**.
