**PROPER:**

**Introit Psalm:** But as for us it behoveth us to glory in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ: **in whom is our salvation our life and resurrection, by whom we were saved and obtained our freedom.** God be merciful unto us and bless us: **and show us the light of his countenance and be merciful unto us.** But as for us...etc.

**Gradual:** Christ became obedient for our sakes unto death: **even the death of the Cross.** Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him: **and given him the Name which is above every name.**

**Offertory Psalm:** The right hand of the Lord hath the pre-eminence; the right hand of the Lord bringeth mighty things to pass: **I shall not die but live and declare the works of the Lord.**

**Communion Psalm:** The Lord Jesus after he had supped with his disciples and had washed their feet said unto them: **Know ye what your Lord and Master have done to you? I have given you an example that ye should do as I have done unto you.**

Mass would proceed in accordance with the order in the yellow service book until after the sermon. Then, in place of the Creed, the Washing of Feet would take place in the crossing under the spire.

After the Post-Communion Prayer, the Blessed Sacrament is carried reverently to the Altar of Repose, accompanied by the singing of the hymn 'Of the Glorious Body telling' (NEH 268). During the final two verses, the celebrant and servers prostrate before the Altar of Repose and cense the Sacrament. The sanctuary is then stripped of its furnishings, while is sung:

**Antiphon:** They parted my garments among them; **and upon my vesture did they cast lots.**  
**followed by Psalm 22.** followed by repetition of the **Antiphon.**

**All would depart in silence.**

**A watch would be kept during the night  
before the Altar of Repose**
