Virtual Rogation Procession 2020 (rec. Friday 15 May for Sunday 17 May)

The Greeting and Welcome at the West Doors

Alleluia! Christ is risen. **He is risen indeed, Alleluia!**

A welcome is offered.

Welcome to this procession for Rogation Sunday.

The three days leading up to Ascension Day are traditionally kept as Rogation Days. Rogation comes from the Latin word 'rogare' meaning 'to ask'. In the rural world these days were an important occasion to ask for God's blessing on the crops which had been planted.

The Rogation procession developed as an opportunity for the priest and people to ask God's blessing on the fields, streams and livestock of the parish. This was sometimes linked to the ceremony of 'Beating the Bounds' which re-established the boundaries of fields, farms and parishes.

But we need God's blessing on our world no less today and an annual Rogation Procession is kept here at Mount Dinham on this Sunday before the Ascension.

So in our prayers we thank God for the glory, beauty and bounty of creation, we pray that the harvest of land, sea and of commerce and industry may be fruitful. But we also pray that these good gifts of God will be equitably shared so that none may go hungry. And increasingly such occasions are vital as we reflect on the urgent need to care better for this planet and to reduce pollution and waste.

And finally at the moment we must pray for healing for our land and our world afflicted by the Covid-19 virus. We believe that God's will is for our healing and so we ask his blessing not only for those who are ill, but also for those suffering through the lockdown a lack of company, of variety, of fellowship and of education. We pray for them, for those researching into cures and vaccines and for the carers and keyworkers who are serving with faithfulness and courage

I am grateful to Richard Barnes who is filming this procession and Richard Parker who will sing the antiphons, all at a proper distance!
